## School Hats

As the warmer weather is upon us, it is important that all students have a school hat. No Hat No Play. School hats are a compulsory part of our school uniform. Hats need to be worn during sport and playtime. School hats can be purchased at the school office for $\$ 12.00 \mathrm{ea}$

## Absences

Our school attendance is currently at $84 \%$, and we would like this to be at $91 \%$. Year 3 are the best followed by Year 5. Attendance plays a very important part in your child's learning. This includes students being late on a regular basis.

## Kindergarten 2020 Orientation Morning

Our Kindergarten 2020 orientation morning will begin on Wednesday, $6^{\text {th }}$ November at 9 am until 10:40am, and will continue for the following two Wednesdays, $13^{\text {th }}$ and $20^{\text {th }}$ of November. Children attending orientation are required to bring a snack and water labelled with the child's name.
There will also be parent information sessions on each of the orientation mornings. The P\&F will be opening the second hand uniform shop on Wednesday $6^{\text {th }}$ November for Kinder 2020 parents. They will also be selling hats $\&$ caps on Wednesdays $13^{\text {th }} \& 20^{\text {th }}$ cash only.

## School Canteen

Important information about our school canteen for parents and students.

- All online orders must be placed before 9am.
- All over the counter orders to be placed by 8:40am at the canteen. No late orders will be taken.
- The canteen will close 5 minutes before the end of recess and lunch to allow students to finish eating or drinking before line up time.
Students and parents are reminded to use their manners at all times when at the canteen.


## Summer Uniform

All students are expected to be in full summer uniform. All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly, including the correct socks. It is expected that children have suitable hairstyles appropriate for their age and school expectations. Long hair must be tied back. Sleeper earrings and stud earrings may be worn. Please be aware that these can be dangerous during sports time. Simple signet rings may also be worn. No expensive jewellery is to be worn at school.

## School Hours

Parents are reminded that lessons begin at $8: 40 \mathrm{am}$ and finish at $3: 00 \mathrm{pm}$. Children should be at school by 8:30am.
There is no supervision in the mornings before the $8: 15 \mathrm{am}$ bell. From 8:15am until 8:30am is a walk and talk time only. Students are reminded that there is to be NO running or ball games in the playground in the mornings. If you are dropping your child/ren off or picking them up from the Parish car park please remind your child/ren about the safety around cars and the dangers of running in this area.
Parents are also reminded that they need to collect their child $/$ ren from school at $3: 00 \mathrm{pm}$. If you are running late please contact the school office. The school office is open from $8: 15 \mathrm{am}$ to $3: 15 \mathrm{pm}$ every day.
