Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers

This morning, NSW Health confirmed that there is a positive case of COVID-19 at St Margaret Mary's Primary Merrylands.

Of course, supervision will be available for all students for the remainder of the day. The school will be closed for deep cleaning. We will keep you updated about when the school will reopen.

As soon as we were contacted by NSW Health, we began working closely together to identify students or staff who have had 'close contact' with the person who has COVID-19. NSW Health will conduct 'contact tracing' and will notify close contacts and advise them about what they need to do next. **Students and staff must self-isolate until receiving further advice from NSW Health or a communica-tion from the school.**

If you need help with translation and interpreting from English, you can find help <u>here</u>. The 24-hour phone number for immediate interpreting help is 131 450.

Please check regularly for symptoms of COVID-19 These symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat or shortness of breath. If your child/children develop these symptoms, please see a doctor (call ahead to alert your doctor about the possibility of COVID-19 before visiting and take this letter with you) or go to a COVID-19 testing clinic. We understand NSW Health is setting up a new pop-up clinic in Merrylands. We will keep you updated about where that will be located. You can find a full list of the clinics <u>here</u>.

If your child/children have a health condition or complex health needs, please discuss this with your medical specialist.

All year 6 students should have now enrolled in a high school for 2021. Parents of year 5 students are advised to start researching high schools for their child to enrol for 2022. Parents, please do not let the cost of high school be a deterrent for enrolling your child into a catholic high school.

Work Health and Safety

In Term 4, St Margaret Mary's School be having our Annual External Safety Audit. At St Margaret Mary's we take great pride in ensuring our students and staff learn and work in a staff environment.

Winter Uniform

All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly **including neck ties** for boys and girls.

All hairstyles should be appropriate to the students age and the schools expectations. Long hair must be tied back. Our Sun Safe program requires students to wear our school cap or hat when outside: **No Hat No Play**. These hats and caps are available at the school office. Sleeper earrings and stud earrings may be worn. Simple signet rings may also be worn. No expensive jewellery is to be worn at school. 

Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC)


