## The Importance of the Institution of the Papacy

(Adjusted from an article sent to Mr Mills by Sr Leone)

The purpose of our life is to be in communion with God. We are all called to this communion and we can all help each other. Our best help comes from the saints in our midst – those who love with Jesus, love.

The local church community is a family into which we have been baptised. We belong to each other. Now it was Jesus' dream that every single human being would come to know his Father, and that the whole world would learn to love as he loved. We are not meant to identify only with the local Christian community. The Church is meant to be universal – that is to say 'Catholic', and it is here that the Pope, the bishop of Rome, has an especially graced role.

As he faced death, Jesus asked Peter to strengthen the other apostles and the community of believers (Luke 22:31-32). This request was made while Jesus was warning Peter that he was going to deny him three times. Paul's ministry, like that of Peter, is not dependent on Paul's personal strength but on God's grace. 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness'. This enables Paul to say: 'When I am weak, then I am strong' (2Corinthians 12:9-10).



Jesus promised to be with his Church till the end of time. He prayed to his Father that his followers would remain united, and it is this promise and this prayer that sustained Peter in his difficult ministry. When Peter died his successors in the church of Rome continued Peter's role of holding all the various local churches together in one family. Like Peter, other popes have denied Jesus and have been responsible for very un-Christlike behaviour. While we recognise the human weakness of individual Popes, let us remember the enormity of the ministry that the Pope has to carry. We have also been blessed with men of

extraordinary courage and sanctity. Jesus promised that his Spirit would never abandon us.

The Pope's ministry is to hold the whole of the Catholic world together. If that is truly of value, surely we can afford a little patience when Rome seems to be moving too slowly. Let us pay him the respect of our humble obedience as he guides us in our teaching, our governing and the loving that makes us holy.

We pray that our Pope, Francis, will be faithful to the grace given him in his important office of guiding us so that we may grow together in holiness.

Long hair must be tied back. Our Sun Safe program requires students to wear our school cap or hat when outside: **No Hat No Play**. Sleeper earrings and stud earrings may be worn. Simple signet rings may also be worn. No expensive jewellery is to be worn at school.

winner that would normally represent our school against other schools is chosen. The winner from Year Six this year was Isabella Blandon



Let's take you back 200 years ago in the new colony...


- The male convicts needed to make 1000 bricks a day. They used clay and moulds to form and shape the bricks. This was very tiring and stressful for the convicts.
- They would count how many bricks they made by putting their fingers into the bricks. One mark represented 100 bricks.
- Convicts worked at sunrise until sunset. They had two meals a day including dinner at 2pm. After dinner they went back to work.
- Cobblers are shoemakers and they needed to make one pair of shoes per day!
- The female convicts worked at the Female Factory and made slops (outfits) during the day.
- This might sound a bit gross but, did you know that in the barracks, (where the male convicts lived) there were no toilets so they did their business in a BUCK-ETI

## **COVID-19 Information**

#### NSW Health Guidelines and Protocols (as of 17<sup>th</sup> August 2020)

The following list contains the up-to-date information and guidelines on Covid-19 from the NSW Government. These will be up-dated as new information and decisions are shared with CEDP. We do acknowledge and understand the difficulty and disappointment of the impact of these new guidelines, but also appreciate the importance of following these protocols. StMM's will always work together to ensure the wellbeing and safety of our Students, Staff, Parents and Carers.

#### Safety and Hygiene

- Students do not attend St Margaret Mary's Primary School if they are unwell.
- Each student who is absent from school or who has been sent home due to flu like symptoms **must be tested**
- Students must not return to school until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom free
- Our Office must **sight the negative COVID-19 test result** prior to allowing students to return to school

i.e. NSW Health or COVID-19 Testing Centre correspondence (SMS or email or hard copy) and/or a medical certificate must be provided to the school and a record of this kept by the school

#### **School Operations**

- Students to stay within their year group for all learning activities, wherever possible.
- StMM's will not travel outside of their local community area or zone.
- Only external providers essential to the delivery of curriculum may continue. This decision remains at the discretion of the Principal, according to its importance to the delivery of the curriculum.

#### **School Related Activities**

- The StMM's Choir and Band will not be operating on site.
- Year 6 Graduation assembly is allowed with restrictions.
- Formal graduation ceremonies are now not allowed.
- P&F social events or functions are not permitted.

#### **Additional Advice**

- 2021 StMM's Kindergarten orientation and transition to school activities **remain on hold until fur**ther notice.
- We will regularly share messages on StMM's Skoolbag App & Website reminding families if their child is unwell, to get them tested and keep them at home.

#### Stopping of certain practices

- Our school-related overnight events (retreats, camps, excursions,)
- StMM's activities (e.g. sports carnivals, school formals, dinners or dances, graduation ceremonies or parent engagement functions)

#### **Ongoing measures**

NSW Health continues to advise schools to:

- exclude students and staff with even mild symptoms of COVID-19
- encourage immediate testing for any symptomatic child(ren) or staff
- ensure that adults maintain physical distancing at all times
- ensure good hand hygiene at all times (e.g. upon entry to the school, entry to the classroom and upon exit of the classroom)
- limit activities that result in the mixing of students and staff from schools from the local area
