Dear Parents, Carers, Boys & Girls,

Life is a journey and becoming better every day is the goal.

"Make the most of yourself....for that is all there is of you." --Ralph Waldo Emerson

The following list is compiled from an article focussing on being a better person. The article listed 15 tips on how to become a better person, however I have selected my **Top 10 (adjusted)!**

- 1. **Compliment Yourself:** Every morning before you go on with your daily routine, take a couple of minutes to give yourself a compliment.
- 2. **Don't Make Excuses:** Blaming others is fruitless and won't get you very far. Instead of pointing fingers and making excuses about why you aren't happy or successful in your personal or professional life, own your mistakes and learn from them.
