Principal's Message

Dear Parent, Carers and Children,

After reading Pope Francis' message for Lent 2022, I have taken two important points to encourage our community during this year's season of Lent. Let us not grow tired! Let us not grow tired of prayer and let us not grow tired of doing good! Pope Francis asks us to reflect on St Paul's letter to the Galatians:

"Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up. So then, while we have the opportunity, let us do good to all" (Gal 6:9-10)



Pope Francis says Saint Paul encourages us to use our time for sowing goodness in view of a future harvest. Lent is certainly such a time as it invites us to conversion, to a change in mindset not so much in possessing as in giving, not so much in accumulating as in sowing and sharing goodness. During Lent, Pope Francis, calls us to respond to God's gift by accepting his word, which is "living and active". Regular listening to the word of God makes us open to his plan for our community and is an activity we can do each day during Lent. We need to pray because we need God.

Let us not grow tired of doing good

Christ's resurrection brightens our lives with the hope of eternal life, planting the seed of salvation in our present time. The Lenten season calls us to place our faith and hope in the Lord, since only if we fix our gaze on the risen Christ will we be able to respond to St Paul's appeal, "Let us never grow tired of doing good" (Gal 6:9). Pope Francis asks us to take special advantage of this Lenten season to care for those close to us and to reach out to our brothers and sisters who lie wounded along the path of life (cf. Lk 10:25-37). Lent is a favourable time to seek out – and not to avoid – those in need; to reach out – and not to ignore – those who need a sympathetic ear and a good word; to visit – and not to abandon - those who are lonely. Let us put into practice our call to do good to all, and take time to love the poor and needy, those abandoned and rejected.

As we enter this important season of our Church, let us take time to pray and do good for all the people in our lives.

COVID-19

Stepping back from COVID Restrictions

From Monday 28th February:

- Families can choose when to use the RAT Kits
- For StMM's, masks will continue to be required indoors for all school staff
- Visitors will be allowed on site (outdoors) in a limited manner (COVID Safe)

From Monday 7 March:

- Morning Arrival & Afternoon dismissal will revert to precovid arrangements
- School visitors will be allowed back on site regardless of their vaccination status
- Masks will no longer be mandatory. Any student or staff member who wants to continue to wear a mask may do so

Morning Arrivals

- 2. Car Drop off (Henson Street) Staff on Duty to Sanitize.

If you are running late you must contact the school office.

Departure Procedures

Afternoon Departure

- 1. Top Church Gate (names of families are called by staff)
- 2. Car Pick-Up Henson Street (Car numbers are called by staff)

Practices for Afternoon Car Pick-Up

- Car Pick-Up commences at 3:00pm
- The only dedicated Car Pick-Up queue is the length of the school block in Henson Street between the Pick-up Signs.
- Joining this queue must be done following all road and traffic rules including signage.
- Parents/Carers are to ensure they give way correctly, taking into account all signs & road rules.
- The Police and Council Rangers will book cars not following the road rules.

Aspects to follow for Car pick-up

- Stagger your arrival between 3:00pm and 3:30pm
- Have your number visible for the teachers to call
- Remain calm and patient at all times
- Adults to remain in car
- Follow all road rules.



Raffle. There will be more information sent out next week with dates and times for preparing raffle tickets, the wrapping of Easter eggs and the raffle draw.






3. Select Add Profile and create a profile for your child/children.
