
All parents are encouraged to have the Skoolbag App, as this will be the main preference for communication to all parents. Our School Name for Skoolbag App is SMMPM.

The Story of St Patrick's

Saint Patrick (c. 385 - c. 461) was a 4th-century Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. It is believed that Patrick was born in Roman Britain, into a wealthy Romano-British family. His father was a deacon, and his grandfather was a priest in the Christian church. At the age of sixteen, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and taken as a slave to Gaelic Ireland. He spent six years there working as a shepherd and during his time there, he "found God". God told Patrick to flee to the coast, where a ship would be waiting to take him home. After making his way home. Patrick went on to become a priest.

It is believed that after returning to Ireland, Patrick converted the pagan Irish to Christianity. He spent many years evangelising in the northern half of Ireland and converted 'thousands". Tradition holds that Patrick died on 17 March 461 and was buried at Downpatrick. Over the following centuries, many legends grew up around Patrick and he became Ireland's foremost saint.



With the first Irish religious settling in the Parramatta area, it was no surprised that the cathedral of the area would be named St Patrick's after the patron saint of Ireland.

Saint Patrick's Day, also known as the Feast of Saint, is a cultural and religious celebration held on 17 March each year. This day is the traditional death date of Saint Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland.

On Saint Patrick's Day, it is customary to wear shamrocks, green clothing or green accessories. Saint Patrick is said to have used the shamrock, a three-leaved plant, to explain the Holy Trinity to the pagan Irish. This story first appears in writing in 1726, though it may be older.




