Dear Parents/Carers and Students

The 40 days of Lent can seem like 40 weeks. But as we travel this journey it is important that we remember it is linked to the time Jesus was in the desert. BCSC (Building Child Safe Communities)

All parents/carers that wish to volunteer and assist the P&F with any activities, must complete the CSPD Building Child Safe Communities online undertaking form and training module for volunteers. This is a legal requirement for Catholic Schools Parramatta Diocese.

- 1. Hover your cursor over 'About'
- 2. Click on 'Student Safety'
- 3. Scroll down & Click on 'Start Training Now'
- 4. Scroll down & Click on 'Start Now'
- 5. Click on ' Begin Undertaking'
- When you get to screen 5 only click on/highlight

'I am a parent or close relative of a child at all of the selected location(s)'

Once your form has been "Submitted", the system will generate an automated email to confirm and approve the status of your submission within 24 hours. All Volunteers need a BCSC status that is *Approved* to provide services to our school.

Important Points to Note:

- Training is valid for 2 years
- After the 2 years you must undertake the training again

WHAT IS THE NCCD?

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) takes place every year. The NCCD is a collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability and the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students. Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability. This 'help' allows them to access education on the same basis as a child without disability.

WHY IS THIS DATA BEING COLLECTED?

All schools in Australia must collect information about students with disabilities. The NCCD ensures that the information collected is transparent, consistent and reliable. It provides better information that improves understanding of students and allows parents, guardians, carers, teachers, principals, education authorities and government to better support students.

WHAT INFORMATION IS COLLECTED?

A student is counted in the NCCD if they receive reasonable adjustments at school due to disability. Each year, schools collect the following information about the student, including: their year of schooling, the level of adjustment received and the broad type of disability. A high level summary of the NCCD data is available to all Australian state and territory governments to improve policies and programs for students with disability.

HOW IS STUDENTS' PRIVACY PROTECTED?

Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students is an essential part of the NCCD. Data is collected within each school. Personal details, such as student names or student identifiers, are not provided to federal education authorities.
