Principal's Message

Dear Parents, Carers and children,

Welcome back from the holiday break, one I hope that has allowed individuals to spend time together and focus on family and fun. We are planning a week of celebration in honour of our patron saint, St Margaret Mary. There are details in this bulletin, and I would encourage all ex-students to visit our school on Tuesday between 3:30 & 4:30pm.

While Mary, the mother of Jesus, is a central figure in Christianity and well-known to many, there are some important and unique aspects of her life and role in Christian tradition. Mary's parents, Joachim and Anne, dedicated her to the service of God at a young age. They brought her to the Temple in Jerusalem, where she lived as a young woman. The title "Mother of God." was affirmed to emphasise Mary's role as the mother of Jesus, who is both fully divine and fully human. This title underscores Mary's importance and her unique role in salvation history. Mary's "yes" to the angel Gabriel's message at the Annunciation is often seen as an exemplary act of faith and obedience. She is viewed as a model of discipleship for all Christians, as her response demonstrates complete surrender to God's will. Her journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem and her steadfast presence at the crucifixion of Jesus also highlight her role as a faithful disciple.

While October is not exclusively dedicated to Mary in the Catholic tradition, it is a month in which we, as Catholics focus on honouring Mary, especially through the praying of the Rosary. The following reasons explain why October is associated with Mary in our Catholic faith:

- 1. Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary: October 7th is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, also known as the Feast of the Holy Rosary. This feast day was established to commemorate the victory of the Christian fleet over the Ottoman Turks at the Battle of Lepanto in 1571.
- 2. Month of the Rosary: October is often referred to as the "Month of the Rosarv" in the Catholic calendar. During this month, Catholics are encouraged to pray the Rosary regularly as a way to meditate on the mysteries of



- Christ's life and to seek the intercession of Mary for various intentions.
- Harvest Season: In many parts of the world, October coincides with the harvest season. This season of abundance and thanksgiving can be seen as an opportunity for Catholics to reflect on Mary as the "Mother of the Harvest" or the one who brings forth the fruits of God's grace and salvation.

Parishes and religious communities often hold special devotions, processions, and events during this month to honour Mary's role as the Mother of Jesus and a model of faith. It's important to note that devotion to Mary is a significant aspect of Catholic spirituality throughout the year, and October is just one of many months when Catholics honour and celebrate her.


A dance program can provide a fun and engaging way to enhance the overall well-being of young learners, creating a positive impact on their future growth and development."
