Dear Parents, Boys and Girls,

I was sorry that I missed Monday's assembly and the announcement from Julia Finn of a grant to support the building of our COLA (covered outside learning area). I wish to thank the individuals who contributed to the application and celebrate with StMM's community on its success. The COLA will run the length of the playground from the staffroom up to the Parish centre and will be a wonderful facility for the school and parish.

It is vital that we remember we are an important part of parish life in Merrylands and I was very pleased to be at the Confirmation last week to celebrate with a large number of students and staff this significant milestone in their life journey. StMM's is a strong Catholic community that works hard to make an impact and difference in the wider community. On Monday morning we were lucky enough to be joined by Julia Finn, the local member for our area of Parliament. Julia told us that she had received a




nomination from Mrs Georges, Mrs Yenco and Ms Tripp, for a

Christmas Card Competition



Feast of Christ the King and Leadership (parts of Fr Michael's Reflection)

Granted the dramatic changes through which we have gone in the last hundred years, many question the wisdom of past organisational leadership in the church. This is an important issue if the Church is going to speak to today's



world about institutional leadership that is inspired by the gospel.

Sunday's readings warn us against putting organisational leadership at the centre of our concern. This is because the leadership portrayed by the crucified Jesus is of a different kind. We are taught to look at Jesus on the cross. It is he who is lord and king. Those who exercised the kind of organisational leadership of which we have been speaking were people like the high priest, Pilate and Herod. They were bad leaders as is made obvious by their criminally unjust crucifying of Jesus. What they did was terrible, and we are right to name it for what it was, and to try to ensure that people in such positions do not abuse their power.

However a much more important lesson is to be learned. The real leadership which we see when we look at the crucifixion is not organisational decision-making leadership. We do not look to the High Priest, or to Pilate or Herod to see the real authority and power that stands out on the hill of Calvary. The most important area for leadership lies in the area of love. Christ the king shows us that ultimate power is the power of love. Ultimate authority is the authority that is exercised in loving. Ultimate leadership is leadership in love. Our lord and king is a victim of the unjust exercise of organisational leadership. But no one could stop him loving, and his self-giving love shines out in splendour from the cross. The love that flows from his pierced and broken heart continues to reveal the power of God and to overcome the evil that comes from the abuse of power.

Change takes time and a lot of courage. But we will bring about good change only in proportion to our love, for love is what God is, and love is what we see in the lord and king of history, reigning from the cross. This view of leadership based on love encourages and allows our full participation in the mystery of Christ.

Year 5 Leadership Process

The process for deciding the Captains for 2019 began last week when Year 5 went on an excursion to the Academy of Sport and Recreation at Narrabeen and participated in a range of activities. The purpose of the day was to put students in a variety of situations where they would need to show leadership.

Following this excursion, students will have an opportunity to nominate students who they believe would make good leaders in 2019. When students are nominating, they must include reasons to support why this person would be a good leader. They are able to nominate up to 3 students. All staff members will also be able to nominate up to 3 students. Once the nominations have been collated, 12 students will be identified and they will have an opportunity to present speeches. Students will need to either accept or decline their nomination before they present their speech. Please note that students will not be guaranteed a Colour Captain position if they decline their nomination for School Captain. The School Captains, School Vice Captains and Pillar Captains will then be decided from this group of 12.

Colour Captains will be decided at a later date using a different process.

Students are encouraged to remember that all of Year 6 are leaders of our school and this process only determines who will be wearing a badge.

Asthma First Aid

- Sit the person upright
 - Be calm and reassuring
 - Do not leave them alone



- Give 4 separate puffs of blue/grey reliever puffer
 - Shake puffer
 - Put <u>1 puff</u> into spacer
 - Take <u>4 breaths</u> from spacer

 $\textbf{Repeat until } \underline{\textbf{4 puffs}} \text{ have been taken}$

Remember: Shake, 1 puff, 4 breaths

R give 2 separate doses of a Bricanyl inhaler (age 6 & over) or a Symbicort inhaler (over 12)



2 Wait 4 minutes

 If there is no improvement, give 4 more separate puffs of blue/grey reliever as above

give 1 more dose of Bricanyl or Symbicort inhaler



4 If there is still no improvement call emergency assistance - Dial Triple Zero (000)

- Say 'ambulance' and that someone is having an asthma attack
- Keep giving <u>4 separate puffs</u> every <u>4 minutes</u> until emergency assistance arrives

R give 1 dose of a Bricanyl or Symbicort every 4 minutes - up to 3 more doses of Symbicor



Call emergency assistance immediately - Dial Triple Zero (000)

- If the person is not breathing
- If the person's asthma suddenly becomes worse or is not improving
- If the person is having an asthma attack and a reliever is not available
- If you are not sure if it's asthma
- If the person is known to have Anaphylaxis follow their Anaphylaxis Action Plan, then give Asthma First Aid

Blue/grey reliever medication is unlikely to harm, even if the person does not have asthma


