Allergies

As you may or may not be aware there are a number of children attending our school who have severe allergies to many different foods. This means that if these children come in contact with any food products they will have a severe allergic reaction.

We also ask that you remind your child/ren not share their lunch or any other food with another child.

Lost Property

All lost property not collected by Friday, 21st June, will be washed and donated to the second hand uniform shop. All food containers not labelled will be thrown into the bin We ask that you please ensure all articles are **clearly labelled** with your child's name so they are returned to your child if lost or abandoned.



School Uniforms

All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly. It is expected that children have suitable hairstyles appropriate to their age and school expectations. Long hair must be tied back. Our Sun Safe programs require students to wear our school cap or hat when outside No Hat No Play. These hats and caps are available at the school office. Sleepers earrings and stud earnings may be worn. Simple signet rings may also be worn. No expensive jewellery is to be worn at school.

Student Medical Information

It is the parents responsibility to inform the school of any changes or updates to their child's medical conditions. For example if your child/ren suffer from asthma or have a medical condition, or have been diagnosed with a condition and you have not informed the school office, could you please do so as soon as possible.
