Gospel: John 9:1-42

As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents that he was born blind?" Neither this man nor his parent sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him. As long as it is day, we must do the works of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

After saying this, he spat on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put it on the man's eyes. "Go," he told him, "wash in the Pool of Siloam." So, the man went and washed, and came home seeing. His neighbours and those who had formerly seen him begging asked, "isn't this the same man who used to sit and beg?" He himself insisted, "I am the man."

Reflect:

The encounter of Jesus with the blind man goes through several phases and is surrounded with much observance and conversation. The man, who has been blind since birth, comes to Jesus with the expressed hope and desire to be able to see. The response of Jesus is surprising! He make a mud paste and places it over the eyes of the blind man. Such an action, bewildering to the onlookers, points to the fact that healing comes from the ordinary stuff of life; mud and clay which is very messy. Even though the blind man's journey from darkness to light seemed to take a ling route, his final reply was one of sureness and Clarity:

"I only know that I was blind and now I see."

Questions:

- Recall times when you have been led to CLARITY through engaging with the ordinary and messy stuff of life.
- Can you remember a time in your life when you have been in a situation that you found difficult and therefore resisted but by trusting and remaining faithful to the situation you received insight and clarity.

Updating Parent Information

School Uniforms

Next week, Year Three and Year Five students will participate in a 'live' online practice test. No results are recorded for these short tests. The purpose of this testing is to trial the platform with many users from around Australia. This will provide an opportunity to identify any load-related issues that may need to be addressed prior to the NAPLAN tests in May.

Year Five will participate on Monday 23rd March with a practice writing test. On Tuesday, 24th March, Years Five and Three will participate in a short 40-minute practice testing during the day.


bottle we collect is worth 10 cents! So far, our school community collected over 400 bottles. which means we raised \$40.00 for Project Compassion in just a few days!


