Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Children

The Difference Between Being Nice and Doing Good.

(Part of an article I read two years ago and links with "We are all in this together")

Being nice and doing good. They're both important but not the same.

Being nice is step one. Just be nice each day, wave when you're let into traffic, smile and say thank you when you get your coffee, help your friends when they need a hand. Just Be Nice. If everyone was nice, all the time, the world would be a much better place to live. Consistency is more important than intensity. It should become habit, so if you remember the time that you were nice, you are probably not being that nice.



Doing good however, is a slightly different proposition. Everyone can achieve the same level of being nice, because it's about what you do. However, the truth is; not everyone can do the same amount of good. Doing good is about helping others. Doing good is less about what you do and more about what happens for the person getting help.



If you want to be nice, it is simple. Show compassion, pay attention, be kind, be nice to everyone you can, including people doing it tough. I have been very please and impressed with the general response of the StMM's Community to the changes regarding arrival and dismissal of the students each day. Our two major afternoon dismissals are Car Pick-Up and Parent Pick-Up. It is vital that all Parents and Carers have the safety of the children at the forefront of their mind when involved in these activities. Everyone must follow the road rules.



Car parks can be dangerous places for young children. Drivers are concentrating on moving their cars in and out of parking bays and don't always think to check for pedestrians. Because our children are small it makes them even harder to be seen. Drivers must take all care and travel at a speed that will allow them to ensure the safety of all pedestrians, young and old.

The recent changes to Car Pick-Up have been made to ensure we are complying with the road rules. It is very important that all drivers are to be patient and courteous, while ensuring they are focussed on the safety of StMM's children.

Changing Practices for Afternoon Car Pick-Up

We have been informed by Police & the Parking Patrol Officers of the Holroyd Area that we only have control of StMM's school block on Henson Street. This means the following:

- We will aim to start Car Pick-Up at 3.00pm
- The only dedicated Car Pick-Up queue is the length of the school block in Henson Street
- Joining this queue must be done following all road and traffic rules including signage
- Parents/Carers are now able to join the Car Pick-Up queue via Davies Street & Henson St
- Parents/Carers are to ensure they give way taking into account all signs & road rules
- Cars that are lined up across from the school block in Henson Street will be booked. The police view this as double parking.

<u>Aspects to follow for Car</u> <u>Pick -Up</u>



- Stagger your arrival between 3.00pm & 3.30pm
- Have your number visible for the teacher to call
- Remain calm and patient at all times
- Adults to remain in cars
- Follow all road rules

Winter Uniform

As from the beginning of next term all students will be required to wear the full winter uniform. This includes ties for boys and girls.

Tune into Your Child's Feelings

Some children might not be worried about coronavirus (COVID-19), but some might be frightened, upset or worried. They might be worried about the virus itself or about how it might affect their lives.

Ask your child how they are feeling and listen to what they say. You can also ask them what they need to feel better. It might reassure your child if you share your own feelings and let them know what you're doing to cope with them.

- Our hope of having face-to-face interviews occurring, based on updated Government Health Guidelines
- Teachers and Staff working with students in the classroom to further determine the student's learning strengths and their areas of improvements

10 STEPS TO A SUCCESSFUL SCHOOL DROP OFF

- All children should be ready for their school day before you reach the drop-off zone.
- If your child is not ready to get out of your car please do not enter the drop-off zone.



- If you have a child that had a melt down en route to school please pull over somewhere private and address the issue.
- In the interest of public safety do not attempt the double play of talking on your phone and driving while negotiating school drop off.
- Do not get out of your car.
- If your child is carrying a large backpack plus other equipment, please make arrangements to help them unload from the safety of the parking lot.
- If you are in a hurry don't honk your horn or attempt to squeeze into a line opening.
- If your child's teacher is on duty please resist the urge to speak about your child
- Never, ever, park in the drop off-line.

In review, the perfect drop off scenario should be as follows:

- 1. Kids are dressed
- 2. Backpacks are ready
- 3. Approach the drop off zone fully alert
- 4. Hands on steering wheel
- 5. Eyes forward when it's your turn for car unloading
- 6. You initiate the "bye bye, have a great day" sequence
- 7. Children unload swiftly and with all of their belongings
