Principal's Message

Dear Parents, Carers and Children.

StMM's Learning Community places a great deal of importance of the skill of reading. We have spent a great deal of money on reading material for our students across the range of Learning Spaces in the school. We are delighted with the support of our parents and carers and the time they are spending reading with, listening to and sharing the love of books with their children. Reading is making meaning from print. It requires that we:

- Identify the words in print a process called **word recognition**
- Construct an understanding from them a process called **comprehension**
- Coordinate identifying words and making meaning so that reading is automatic and accurate – an achievement called **fluency**

5 Key tips for encouraging young readers

- Make time for **reading**. Set aside a regular read-aloud time with your child each day.
- Choose **reading** material at the right level for your child's abilities.
- Look for a variety of **reading** material.
- Exhibit your own love for **reading**.
- Provide access to books and don't rely on technology.

Top 6 tips to help children enjoy reading


- Make books a part of family life Always have books around at home. That way you and your children are ready to get reading, even if it's only for ten minutes.
- Read about something they're interested in Help your child find the right book for them. It doesn't matter if it's fiction, poetry, comic books or non-fiction.
- All reading is good Don't rule out non-fiction, comics, graphic novels, magazines or leaflets. Reading is reading and it's all worthwhile.
- **Ask questions** To keep them interested in the story, ask your child questions as you read. Start with 'Where did we get to last time?', 'Can you remember what's happened so far?' and 'What do you think will happen next?'.
- Read favourites again and again Encourage your child to re-read the books and poems they love. Re-reading helps to build fluency and confidence.
- Enjoy bedtime stories Read with your kids at bedtime as often as you can. It's a great way to end the day and to spend valuable time with them.

The following is a simple saying in education: **We** learn to read, and then, we read to learn. Please keep this at the forefront of your mind when you spend time with your child reading and thank you all for your support.
