

Principal's Message

Dear Parents, Carers, Boys & Girls,

'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them anymore but only Jesus.

Mark's Gospel last week portrays the scene of the Transfiguration. It was an experience shrouded in mystery for the three apostles who accompanied Jesus. We know that there are five people in the story and each is given a name; Moses, Elijah, Jesus, Peter, James and John.

The Gospel of the Transfiguration reveals to us the importance of having a group identity. The two ancestors of Jesus' kinship, Moses and Elijah represent two important pillars of a faith community – the law (Moses) and the prophets (Elijah). As we move further into our Lenten journey let us reflect on our identity in our Christian faith community and ways in which we can deepen this understanding of our kinship in Christ.



We have a strong identity of service and belonging at StMM's, one which we have worked hard to strengthen, under our Faith Community pillar. Building on our relationship with our parish is vital to understand our connection to Jesus and his mission. We often use the phrase "What would Jesus do?" with the children as a link to his actions on earth.

The following questions can focus your attention on your own personal Lenten journey.

- Where do you find your true identity and your secure place of belonging?
- Jesus had many significant signposts or touchstones in the unfolding of his journey. What are your signposts?

Remember our Lenten Journey is an opportunity to do better and bring us closer to our God.

Entering and Exiting the School for Students

There are two ways for students to enter and exit the school in the mornings and afternoons from now on.

Morning Arrivals

- 1. Top Church Gate
- 2. Car Drop off

Afternoon Dismissal

- 1. Top Church Gate
- 2. Car Pick-up

Please note the Year 2 Gates will not be open for general traffic as a matter of safety.

All visitors to the school including parents enter the school via the school office and must sign in.

Excursions

It is important for all students and parents to note that all incursions and excursions are an important part of learning at STMM's. With regards to children attending (including sport-



ing events), the school has a process whereby children with inappropriate behaviour may be unable to participate in these events. The decisions regarding students attendance is the responsibility of the Principal and Assistant Principal. The school will endeavour to consult and inform parents if there are concerns about a child's attendance at these events.

Car Pick Up

Please be aware, the Car pick up is a voluntary service for our school community. Thank you to all the parents and students who are following the guidelines. It is expected all students read a book while they are sitting with their family waiting for their number to be called. Student who are unable to do this will not be able to participate in the Car pick up service.

- Space your arrivals after 3pm.
- All students must have a book to read
- · Be patient, attentive and obey all road rule
- Police will book parents

Teacher/Parent/Student Interviews

We appreciate all the parents that have already booked online for the upcoming Teacher/Parent/Student Interviews. We look forward to having our community on-site for this occasion and ask that you follow all our procedures as the safety and wellbeing of our community members is very important to us.

NSW Department of Education & CEDP request that we have a COVID Safe Plan in place and all individuals must follow the following procedures:

- Parents/carers may only enter the school for these interviews after booking a time with your child's class teacher. (Completed via 'schoolinterviews' website.)
- Parents/carers will be required to scan the QR code using Service NSW app
- Staff will record the name/s of the parent/carer for StMM's records.
- Parents/carers are to sanitise hands upon entering the learning space/s and keep 1.5m distance between other adults.

For the beginning of the school days Monday 15th March - Thursday 18th March, all students when entering the school will go to one of the following areas.

- All primary students (3-6) will go to the lower grass
- All infants (K-2) will go the covered area on the top playground
- All students will remain here until their class teachers collect them. (This is part of COVID safe practices for schools).

For Interviews before school:

Please enter the top parish gate ONLY, have your name ticked off then proceed straight to the assigned waiting area.

For interviews after school

You may enter from the top parish gate, as well as the lower gate (car pick-up area) and go straight to the assigned waiting area.

Assigned Waiting Areas:

- Infants:- Go straight to the outside undercover area in infants and wait there for the teacher - do not enter the corridors please
- 2. **Primary:** Go straight to the seats in the corridor outside your child's learning space.

Please note

- No other older students/family members are allowed on premises.
- 2. Children must remain with the adult they are not to walk along corridors, nor play outside
- You are requested to come on time and exit as soon as possible after your interview/s
- There will be a range of staff on duty to support the procedures listed above.

cause it congratulates all the Year 6 leaders of 2021. Father Janusz wel-


comed everyone back and told us all about trusting one another and that we should be gracious to one another. When the Mass was about to finish, Father Janusz blessed the badges so the parents




Teaching & Learning

Year 2(RFF)

During Discovery Learning we have been learning about natural resources and ways to care about them. We planned an experiment



to test which natural resources plants need to grow. We planned our experiment, by writing our aim, hypothesis (prediction), mate-



results each week.

Each class tested a different resource in a controlled experiment. We learnt about only changing one variable to make it a fair test. 2 Red tested sunlight by placing a plant in the cupboard, 2 Blue tested air by placing the plant in a bag and 2 Yellow

tested water by not watering the control plant. We have been watching the seeds grow into grass seedlings. So far, the seeds that were not watered and did not have air, have not grown. To our surprise the plant that has no sunlight is growing slowly but it is vellow. Some of our seeds are already more than 10cm tall, after one week. We are excited to see what will happen with our controlled experiments. I wonder if you have planted a seed at home and watched it grow?
