Principal's Message

Dear Parents & Carers,

The church's liturgical year begins, as you know, with Advent - a time of preparation for Christmas. So next Sunday is the last Sunday of the Church's year. For this reason, we are invited by the readings of the Mass to look at the goal of our life and to ask 'What is my life all about? Where am I headed?' We are invited to make a review of the past year.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of the end of his world, he could see that it was about to collapse. He spoke about to his disciples and emphasize the importance of how we live. So, as another liturgical year draws to a close, let us pause and take stock. Are we following our deepest desires, or are we allowing ourselves to be distracted from our heart, laughing half our laughter and crying half our tears. Jesus came that we may live to the full. Is that how things are for us?



In our earthly courts we go before a judge or a magistrate who hears the evidence and, if we are guilty, he or she imposes a punishment determined by law. The judgment of God is very different. We simply stand before God as we are, knowing that shall be we cannot hide from God who sees the whole truth. If we have closed our hearts on God, we choose to spend all eternity without communion with God.

God does not punish. God will always love you and love me. But God cannot and will not force his love upon us. It is important to realize that we cannot change God. God changes us and has one desire to be in communion with those whom he has created. The Catholic Catechism reminds us that: 'God 'desires all to be saved'[1Timothy 2:4], and for him 'all things are possible'[Matthew 19:26]'(Catechism n.1058). God has only one plan for each of us. His purpose is that we receive his love and live in the communion that we call heaven, with God and with all who love him.

Another year in the Church's life is drawing to a close. A section of our life is over and can never come again. Let us pray today to recover our vision and to have the

courage to turn away from anything that hinders our journey towards that fullness of joy for which we were created and for which we long.

Year 6 End of Year Events

During the past week, there have been over 40 primary schools directly affected by closures within their community due to outbreaks of Covid cases in certain grades. The impact of Covid continues to play an important role in the operation of schools.



This brings a great deal of uncertainty to our planning and the need to control what we can plan for the end of year events.

Taking this into account the 2021 Year 6 Graduation events will follow the same format as last year, being held at the school.

At this stage, we are still hopeful that if the restrictions are lifted, we will be allowed to have a Graduation Mass (something we missed last year). We will keep our community informed as we head to the end of the year.

StMM's 2021 Semester 2 Reports

The recent 2021 COVID Lockdown has had a significant impact on our community, with a number of students still not attending school. This has resulted in StMM's staff reviewing the Semester 2 Reports. This has led to a new process and report reflecting and responding to the changes to learning and teaching during Term 3 and early Term 4.

The report considers the 12 weeks of Home Learning and the need to focus on the wellbeing of our students on their return to school. The report recognises the four areas: Religious Education, English, Maths & Guided Discovery

The report lists the curriculum content and skills that have been planned during the Home Learning period. While the report will look different, it will still provide parents with information about your child's learning and efforts and complies with the Federal and State Government requirements.

This Friday, Year 5 will be participating in a Year 5 Leadership Day where they will have the opportunity to demonstrate leadership qualities themselves and identify these qualities in other students. Students will need to wear mufti clothes and sports shoes and bring water and morning tea. A pizza lunch will be provided.


In Week 7, students will be asked to nominate individuals who they believe would make a good leader in 2022. When students are nominating, they must include reasons to support why this person would be a good leader. They are able to nominate up to 3 students, including themselves.

All staff members will also be able to nominate up to 3 students. Once the nominations have been collated, 12 students will be identified and they will have an opportunity to present speeches. Students will need to either accept or decline their nomination before they present their speech.

Please note that students will not be guaranteed a Colour Captain position if they decline their nomination for School Captain. The School Captains, School Vice Captains and Pillar Captains will then be decided from this group of 12.

Colour Captains will be decided at a later date using a different process.

Students are encouraged to remember that all of Year 6 are leaders of our school.
