Principal's Message

Dear Parent, Carers & Students,

Last Sunday we celebrated the fourth Sunday of Easter, which is also called Good Shepherd Sunday. The image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd and the community as his sheep has endured for hundreds of years as a primary image in our faith tradition. The image speaks to us about protection, security and care that shepherds represented to their sheep. In our relationship with Jesus, we know Jesus' voice and are called to follow. Jesus doesn't just bring us closer to the Father, Jesus puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us (from Holy Spirit bulletin, Nth Ryde). This is also the role of our parents and carers, as they have chosen to send their children to a Catholic school to build a strong relationship with your God.

Sunday's Gospel (Jn 10:27-30) reflects the power of the image of the Good Shepherd:



l give my sheep eternal life. Jesus said:

'The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice:

I know them and they follow me.
I give them eternal life;
They will never be lost
No one will ever steal them from me.
The Father who gave them to me
Is greater than anyone,
And no one can steal from the Father.
The Father and I are one.

It is the role of all the adults in the lives of our children to be assistant shepherds; to guide, direct, care and support their flock and follow the path of God.

Enrolments K2023

Kindergarten 2023 enrolments will close on Sunday 22nd May. If you have not yet returned your form or do not have an interview time, please contact the school office as soon as possible.

If your child was born between 1st August, 2017 and 31st July, 2018, please collect an enrolment application from the school office. Applications need to be returned as soon as possible. We have received over 100 applications. Letters of offer will be sent out over the coming weeks.

School Uniforms

Please email the office if you have any issues with Lowes Parramatta in securing the winter uniform as we are aware of difficulties with stock. Because of this situation we understand that some students will need to wear their summer uniform until stock arrives.

Lowes in Parramatta Westfield is our only supplier of the StMM's school uniform.

Please note: StMM's <u>does not</u> have a long sleeve sports polo as part of the school uniform.

School Communication

There are three main forms of communication for our community.

- 1. SkoolBag App messages (will transition to Compass Parent Portal by the end of Term 2)
- 2. Compass Parent Portal (CEDP electronic communication for all schools)
- 3. StMM's School Bulletin (Paper copy & Electronic)

As we transition from SkoolBag to Compass you may receive a duplication of information. We would suggest you delete your SkoolBag App as this will cease operation at the end of Term 2.

COVID


Please note the following: If your child returns a positive Covid test, they are unable to attend school for the duration of their isolation. Close contacts do not have to isolate if they have no Covid symptoms and comply with the following guidelines in relation to school:


- Notify StMM's that they are positive or a close contact
- It is suggested to wear a face mask indoors (chn under 12).
- Undertake daily Rapid Antigen tests (RATs) before school each day.
- RAT kits will be issued to student or staff members if they become symptomatic.
- Guidelines in place for 7 days from the time a person in their household tested positive for COVID-19.

In addition to the above points close contacts must notify StMM's if they are intending to return as we will need to maintain this record on our management systems. Please note at this stage according to NSW Health, no student or staff member identified as a close contact will be permitted to participate in overnight excursions, including school camps.



NCCD Information

WHAT IS THE NCCD? The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students (NCCD) takes place every year. The NCCD is a that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability and the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students. Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school to support their learning. This 'help' allows them to access education on the same basis as other students.

WHAT INFORMATION IS COLLECTED? A student is counted in the NCCD if they receive reasonable

adjustments at school. Each year, schools collect the following information about the student, including: their year of schooling; the level of adjustment received and the broad type of disability. A high level summary of the NCCD data is available to all Australian state and territory governments to improve policies and programs for all students.

WHY IS THIS DATA BEING COLLECTED? All schools in Australia must collect this information. The NCCD ensures that the information collected is transparent, consistent and reliable. It provides better information that improves understanding of students and allows parents, guardians, carers, teachers, principals, education authorities and government to better support students.

HOW IS STUDENTS' PRIVACY PROTECTED? Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students is an essential part of the NCCD. Data is collected within each school. Personal details, such as student names or student identifiers, are not provided to federal education authorities.

Dear friends and colleagues in ministry

From the beginning of 2023, a new structure of governance of Catholic Schools will be created in the Diocese of Parramatta. The current Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) will have a new incorporated governance model centred on a Board made up of community members. The organisation will operate as a company limited by guarantee with the Trustees of the Diocese of Parramatta as the sole Member. It is a carefully considered response to recommendations arising from a comprehensive governance review.

This contemporary model of ecclesiastical and civil governance is aimed at enhancing synodality and subsidiarity. It is designed to enhance collegiality and strengthen decision-making and accountability. It is also about our Catholic community leading together to support the Mission of the Church and continuing to provide local families with great opportunities to grow in faith and learning across Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains.

The change to the new governance model is not expected to have an impact on the day-to-day operation of schools, or on students, staff, parents and carers, and parishes.

Please continue to pray for the Diocese of Parramatta as we work together, inspired by the Holy Spirit, to serve the People of God in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains.
