

Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque was born on July 22, 1647 at L'Hautecour, Burgundy, France. On the death of her father, when she was eight years old, she was sent to the Poor Clares school at Charolles. Margaret Mary suffered with rheumatic fever until she was fifteen. During this time, she developed an early devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. In 1671 she entered the visitation convent at Paray-le-Monial and was professed the next year.

From the time she was entered, she experienced visions of Christ, and on December 27, 1673, she began a series of revelations that were to continue over the next year. During these visions Christ informed her that she was His chosen instrument to spread devotion to His Sacred Heart. He instructed her to a devotion that was to become known as the Nine Fridays and the Holy Hour and asked that the feast of the Sacred Heart be established. She gained the support of Blessed Claude La Colombiere, who declared that the visions were genuine. In 1683, opposition in the community ended when Mother Melin was elected Superior and named Margaret Mary her assistant.

She later became Novice Mistress, saw the convent observe the feast of the Sacred Heart privately beginning in 1686, and two years later, a chapel was built at the Paray-le-Monial to honour the Sacred Heart; soon observation of the feast of the Sacred Heart spread to other Visitation convents. Margaret Mary died at the Paray-le-Monial on October 17, and was canonized in 1920. She, St. John Eudes, and Blessed Claude La Colombiere are called the "Saints of the Sacred Heart"; the devotion was officially recognized and approved by Pope Clement XIII in 1765, seventy-five years after her death. Her feast day is observed on October 17.

Student Attendance

Parents are reminded that even a few days away from school can have an extremely negative impact on student's educational progress. At StMM's teaching continues until 3pm each day of term. The NSW Education Act (1990) requires every child from 6 years to 17 years of age to be at school every day. The only acceptable reason for an absence is an illness or a situation approved by the principal.

Building Update

All our students are now settled into their new primary spaces and are very much looking forward to sharing their work next week with our visitors. There are still a number of aspects that need to be finished outside our building with the company moving quickly to finalise, including our signage, protective fence, storm water issues and a range of defects. The playground has been cleaned twice since work was completed in the holidays.

School Uniforms

Students return for Term 4 in Full Summer Uniform. All uniforms must be worn neatly and correctly, including the correct socks. It is expected that children have suitable hairstyles appropriate for their age and school expectations. Long hair **must** be tied back. Our Sun Safe program – No Hat No play requires student to wear our school cap or school hat when outside. These hats and caps are available to purchase at the school office.

Leaving

If you know your child/ren will not be returning to StMM's in Term 4 or at the end of 2022, please let the office know as soon as possible, in writing, as we have several families on our waiting list. It is a CEDP Policy that 10 weeks' notice is given to the principal before the removal of your child from the school, otherwise a full term fees will be required to be paid.




