

Principal's Message

History & Tradition of All Saints and All Souls

(Adjusted from the Archdiocese of Melbourne)

In the Catholic tradition, November is traditionally a month of remembrance of the dead. The month begins with the Solemnity of All Saints on 1 November and the Commemoration of the All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day), on 2 November. While no longer holy days of obligation in Australia, the Church has consistently encouraged prayers for the faithful departed and, during November, a list of the names of the dead is usually placed in the church so that the community can remember them in prayer.

All Saints' Day commemorates all the saints in heaven. The feast dates back to the early Church, when communities would gather and celebrate the anniversary of the martyr's death. During the persecution under the emperor Diocletian at the beginning of the fourth century the number of martyrs became so great that a separate day could not be assigned to each saint, so the Church established a common feast day for all the martyrs.

The liturgical celebration on the day before the feast became known as hallowed evening or Hallowe'en. All Saints Day represents the desire of the faithful to commemorate all saints, especially those who have no proper feast day of their own.

All Saints' Day is a time to consider the example saints offer us and to reflect on how we can imitate their lives. As Pone Benedict

and to reflect on how we can imitate their lives. As Pope Benedict XVI said, All Saints' Day calls us 'to see the Church... as Christ wanted it, that is, as the communion of saints.'

All Souls' Day follows All Saints Day on 2 November and is also known as the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and the Day of the Dead. It is a day of prayer and remembrance for the souls of those who have died. Believers remember, pray and offer Mass. All Souls Day originally was celebrated in the Easter season, around Pentecost Sunday.

By the tenth century, the celebration had been moved from Pentecost to October. The day is dedicated to prayer and remembrance, with requiem Masses held. A plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead on All Souls' Day, by visiting a Church and praying the Lord's Prayer and the Creed.


to the top of a viewing tower which gave us an amazing view of the whole park. After a busy day of fun and learning we arrived back at school, tired and excited to share our adventures with our families.


Touch Football

5.	Teach your child what personal information they should not reveal online (YAPPY acronym).	6.	Help your child learn to filter information online and navigate fact from fiction.	
7.	Navigate digital dilemmas with your child. Avoid using devices as rewards or punishment.	8.	Balance green time and screen time at home. Focus on basic developmental needs.	
9.	Don't support your child to sign up for sites with age restrictions (e.g 13+) if they're underage.	10.	Learn more : Explore reliable resources for parents so you can educate yourself.
