Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Carers and Students

Since the beginning of the term there has been an increasing number of social media issues that I have had to deal with. This was a result of inappropriate access to Apps and poor students' choices. These issues range across a number of Primary grades, and while these have been dealt with at a school level it is important students are aware of their responsibilities. I have reinforced this with a number of phone calls to parents of children who were unaware of their child's online actions and activities.

I have drawn from a range of resources on the internet to share a number of helpful hits. A great website to visit and share with your child is the: eSafety Comissioner's https://www.esafety.gov.au/

The following key questions can help you determine your child's readiness for social media:

- Is your child old enough to access the social media platform?
- Does your child know how to deal with negative online experiences?
- Does your child understand the importance of protecting their personal information?
- Does your child understand how privacy settings for social media work?
- · Does your child understand what is safe to share online?
- Does your child know how to report cyberbullying and other kinds of abusive content?

Parents can use a three-step approach to establish a good framework for both safeguarding their children's privacy and guiding them to make safe independent choices. Although you can start to implement these steps at any point, starting early will help it become a normal part of a child's life.

TEACH YOURSELF: Get to know how the privacy settings on your (and your children's) devices and how they work.

BOUNDARIES, GUIDELINES, AND LIMITS: Set up age appropriate and realistic expectations about how online devices are used in your household.

DO IT TOGETHER: Joining in and sharing digital activities with your child is one of the most effective ways of protecting them against privacy risks.

Some last words of wisdom!

- Most social media platforms have minimum age of 13 years and older.
- Please don't believe your child when they say; "Everyone at school has a mobile and I need one!' (this is far from the truth!!!)
- All primary aged children should share their passwords with their parents
- Always be positive in your dealing online and if you don't like what is happening remove yourself from the platform.

We will continue to work with our students to educate them around the positive use of the internet. We appreciate the support of our community with this work.

Naplan Year 3 & 5 students

Over the next two weeks, all students in Year 3 and Year 5 will be participating in the annual NAPLAN Assessments. The Naplan testing window begins on Wednesday 15 March and concludes on Monday 27 March. Students who are absent when their class participates in the tests can sit catch-up tests later in the test window. If your child will be away during the NAPLAN testing time, please ensure you have notified your child's teacher via the school office.

All students in Year 3 and 5 must have working **headphones or earbuds** at school for the duration of the two weeks. If your child **does not** have a pair of headphones or earbuds at school already, we kindly ask parents to purchase these over the weekend and to bring them to school on Monday 13 March.



The Second Sunday of Lent and the Transfiguration of the Lord.

Dear friends in Christ,

Not long after my Installation as your pastor, I desired to hold a Diocesan Synod in order to develop a pastoral plan which would follow my predecessor's "Faith in Our Future" and chart a new pathway for the Diocese. However, we had to wait for the long-delayed national Plenary Council to conclude.

Today, after much prayer and consultation, I formally announce the convocation of the Synod in the Diocese of Parramatta. This will be the first Synod in the history of our young Diocese. Like the national and universal synods, ours will be also held in two phases. The first assembly will be held from Thursday 12 to Sunday 15 October 2023 and the final assembly will be held near the middle of next year 2024.

Recognising the fruits of the Plenary Council and in the spirit of synodality, to which you have already contributed so deeply, I invite you to walk with me as we discern further a framework by which we can revitalise our Church in the Diocese and discover together a path of renewal for all of us.

I have appointed a Preparatory Commission to lead this process, chaired by Sr Ailsa Mackinnon RSM, Chancellor of Ministries and Qwayne Guevara as the Lead Facilitator.

Pope Francis has called the entire People of God into a journey of listening and discernment, inviting the Holy Spirit to guide us towards personal conversion and renewal in the Church. Pope Francis explains that 'The journey of synodality is the journey that God wants from His church in the third millennium'.

In preparation towards the Synod, I encourage you to participate in prayer, listening, discernment and local action, guided by the Holy Spirit, as we seek to witness to the Gospel and foster a more welcoming, compassionate, and humble Church. The Diocesan Synod will have a significant impact on the way in which we live out community and mission.

The time is now, here in the Diocese of Parramatta, for us to 'go out into the deep' (Luke 5:4) and step into the future that awaits us - one that is inspired by the deep understanding that God's love is not reserved for a few, but for all. Let us accompany one another along this path with firm hope and abiding trust in our God who desires our good, and who dwells among us.

St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, pray for us.
