Principal's Message

Dear Parent, Boys & Girls,

My top six points in nurturing the faith journey of a child at StMM's:



- 1. Nurture a strong faith foundation:** As a parent, it's important to instil and foster a strong foundation of faith. Engage your child in regular prayer, attend Mass together as a family, and encourage their participation in religious education programs.
- 2. Teach Catholic values:** Help your child understand and embrace the core values of Catholicism, such as compassion, forgiveness, humility, acceptance and service to others. Emphasize the importance of living these values in their daily lives.
- 3. Provide religious education & encourage participation in sacraments:** Ensure that your child receives appropriate religious education. This will deepen their knowledge of the faith and help them grow spiritually. Guide your child in receiving the sacraments of the Catholic Church, such as baptism, reconciliation, Eucharist, and confirmation. These sacraments are essential milestones in their faith journey.
- 4. Foster a prayerful life:** Teach your child the importance of regular prayer. Encourage them to develop a personal prayer routine, including prayers before meals, bedtime prayers, and spontaneous prayers throughout the day. Help them understand the different types of prayers and their significance.
- 5. Lead by example:** Be a role model for your child by living out your Catholic faith authentically. Demonstrate love, forgiveness, and kindness in your interactions with others. Show them the joy and peace that come from living a life centered on God.
- 6. Participate in the Catholic community and embrace a loving and supportive environment:** This will help them develop a sense of belonging and foster relationships with peers. Create a loving and supportive home environment where your child feels safe to express their thoughts and emotions about their God. faith. Assure them of your unwavering love and support throughout their spiritual journey.

No Selling of Items or food at StMM's



Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (Pacer)

Year Six students from our school will be undertaking an education tour of the national capital on Monday 5th June & Tuesday 6th June. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.



The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
